
The Pontifical Society of Holy Childhood in Korea was established in 1965 and initiated its activities in 1987 by recruiting members and publishing bulletins for children. Since then, by conducting education and distributing materials for mission, the national office has contributed in formation of catechists and pastors, who will accompany children in their journey towards a more mature missionary consciousness. To help children in North Korea, where still there is a division, nationwide tour was held. Also, a group named 'Pilgrimage of Missionary Children' was founded to carry out activities such as Three Kings events, pilgrimages on foot, volunteer works and programs for missionary experiences.

Every year the national office organizes a summer camp and invites children from all over the country to encourage them to discover and promote missionary awareness, communion, and spirit of fraternal sharing. Children participating in the camp experience the missionary spirit of apostles who were sent to all over the world, and this brings their attention to Gospel and mission. On

the last day of camp, paper coupons called 'talent' collected by children through programs are exchanged to real money to help children in mission territories. While drawing interests to the needs of children who are materially poor, children practice to carry out inter-exchange of charity and missionary dynamism by opening themselves to one another.





COVID-19 pandemic has impacted the Holy Childhood in Korea by reducing many opportunities of face-to-face meetings for members such as Sunday Schools and camps. However, the national office is seeking ways to renew the Holy Childhood and missionary animation suitable for 'Untact' era (a combination of the prefix 'un' and the word 'contact', 'Untact' is a way of doing things without direct contact with others) by developing digital contents and preparing working methods for constant dialogues with members.

HAYANG-E OFFICIAL CHARACTER FOR THE HOLY CHILDHOOD IN KOREA



Celebrating 100 years of the elevation to Pontifical of the Society of Holy Childhood, the national office made its own character to promote children's awareness of the society and to increase their interests in missionary work. 'HAYANG-E' by its pronunciation, has meaning of 'pure and innocent lamb loved by God'. The crown on top of the head symbolizes shape of 'children helping children' from the logo of the national office. The logo of the Vatican was also inserted into the chest to give the meaning of the Holy Children, acting at the service of the Pope.

On World Mission Sunday, national director and crew of the national office met children in Guseong parish in diocese of Suwon. A chance for a lively conversation enriched communion by introducing the Holy Childhood to children and sharing stickers of 'HAYANG-E'. Children who were attracted to the charism of the society joined the Holy Childhood,



and promised to participate in prayers and sacrifices for the poor children around the world as missionary children.

By using and placing character in bulletins and media, it is expected that children will actively communicate with the Holy Childhood in Korea with more interest and joy.

stories of saints and news of children in mission territories, which makes children in Korea to imitate saints who witness of faith in their lives and build spiritual communion with children in need all over



the world.

Moreover, children send notes to the national office to share their stories with other friends about encountering and experiencing Jesus in their daily lives. They become 'witnesses' and true believers who let the universal missionary spirit grow in their hearts.
